Drive, Chip & Putt

Our Section will be hosting 10 local qualifiers and 2 sub-regional <u>qualifiers</u> this season for the 2018 Drive, Chip and Putt Championship. The Championship is open to boys and girls ages 7 – 15. Boys and girls will compete in separate divisions over four age categories. Junior League Golf (JLG)
