## **President's Report**

I thas been a pleasure to serve as your president since we last were all together at our 2023 Fall Membership Meeting. We had another mild winter and lots of golf was played. Even though the winter was not so bad, I hope you all got to take some time off to recharge the batteries and be ready for a busy 2024; there is so much to be excited about as we look into the future of the game.

At the PGA of America Annual Meeting in November last year, the Association was very close to eclipsing the 30,000 member mark, and since that time we have reached that number. However, an alarming number of our membership will be entering the retirement age window in the next 10-15 years. There has never been a better time to be a young person entering the golf business. We need to take this message to the next generation. The biggest issue I hear and we continually work on is recruitment of young talent into the golf business. However, compensation numbers continue to rise, the game is growing and our work-life balance is slowly improving. We need to make this clear to the future PGA of America Members we will need to secure and protect the game into the future.

It was great to see Jeff Kiddie and Johnny Carpineta presented with national awards at the Annual Meeting last year. I am so pleased to see both Jim Smith, Philadelphia Cricket Club (Bill Strausbaugh Award), and Dean Kandle, St. Davids G.C. (Professional Development Award) selected as national award winners for 2024. To have four national award winners in two years is quite an accomplishment. Well done, folks!

Our PGA HOPE footprint continues to grow as we now have 14 total locations in 2024. This is four more than we had in 2023. Within a week of registration opening 12 of the 14 were sold out. We are growing the game giving back and sometimes saving lives with this program. I know we are all busy but if you can volunteer to

help at a PGA HOPE clinic once or twice this year we would really appreciate it. These veterans served our country and having the chance to help them out is a true privilege. We run a spring and a fall program at the C.C. of Harrisburg, and I can tell you I have gotten way more out of volunteering for it than I have put into it. Funny how volunteering for great causes seems to always go that way.

Our educational programs continue to be well attended. The Rules webinars, Teaching & Coaching Summit, monthly Coaches Corner, and more are thriving. I am also pleased to say we had a great year with our Philadelphia PGA Junior Tour in 2023 and things look to be even better for 2024.

This only touches on the great progress the Philadelphia PGA Section continues to see and none of it would be possible without you, our membership. Thanks to all of you who serve on a committee, host a junior tour event, help or host a PGA HOPE chapter, host a tournament, or serve in countless other ways. None of what we do works without the almost 900 of you who help. I also want to thank our Section staff for all they do for us every day. When we travel around to national meetings, we realize not many of the 41 Sections do what we do on the scale we do it.

It has been a great start to my two years as president, and I look forward to seeing more success stories and great things from this group. I appreciate the opportunity to serve, and thank you for all you continue to do to grow this great game.

### **Vice President's Report**

elcome to the 2024 season to my fellow PGA of America Golf Professionals. Since being elected in autumn, I've been busy serving you and your fellow members, and I'm excited for your continued trust in me as a Section officer.

The section continues to move forward and grow and it has been a pleasure to be a small part of this. Our section staff continues to do a wonderful job keeping our finances in order. There is a lot of hard work behind the scenes and my sincere appreciation for Geoff, Barb, and Sue for all they do for us every day on these matters.

Our forecasted budget for 2024 includes a net profit of \$42,457. This is obviously forecasted and things can change. Last year's net income (mainly from the junior department) allowed us to pay off an auto loan and as we continue to look into wise, short-term investment opportunities. The board voted unanimously to not increase dues, however the increase you'll see of \$25 is coming from the PGA of America. This was passed at the 2023 Annual Meeting, and it is their first dues increase in over 40 years. Of the over \$600 in annual dues you pay, only \$125 of that goes to national; the rest goes back to your Section.

I think it's important to share how the Section operates based on our revenue streams. There are three different buckets in our operations, not including PGA REACH Philadelohia, which are G&A, professional tournaments and junior golf. With our forecasted net profit, junior golf brings in \$147,000 in net revenue. This means without our junior tour operations being as successful as they are, your dues would only increase, and our Section Operations would fundamentally change.

The next big component is PGA REACH Philadelphia. We have a lot of opportunities to take advantage of to help fundraise and contribute to the foundation. Please take an opportunity to get involved, fundraise, play in the REACH pro-am, or simply volunteer for a PGA HOPE event.

Our restricted fund ended 2023 at a position of \$596,000. Our market value increased over \$45,000 last year, and we were able to replace the roof of our Section home and improve HVAC efficiency. Our board works closely with our team at Haverford to ensure we're in the best positions, and are currently evaluating our home office, high rate, short-term CDs and other financial investment vehicles to protect our assets. We also recently paid off an outstanding loan at a high interest rate to save interest.

Since the Fall Meeting, we attended the PGA

of America Annual Meeting in Frisco, Texas, as well as the PGA Show, and most recently the Super Regionals. At the Annual Meeting, finances were a big talking point, as the PGA of America laid off 22 employees, have had to insert themselves in the golf ball rollback talk, as well as the PGA Tour's global fight, and the PGA of America also unveiled a new logo. This is part of a larger marketing campaign and brand awareness campaign.

At the PGA Show, it was announced that Dean Kandle and Jim Smith Jr. are national award winners; congratulations! Lastly, at our Super Regional, Chip Richter and I attended and met all four candidates for PGA Secretary. Regardless of the outcome, we are confident the Association will gain a great future officer from one of the four candidates.

Don Rea is still doing his monthly conference calls, which I participate in monthly. He has started with a guest speaker for each call, and touches on the most pressing points each month. These calls have really opened up the lines of communication from national on down and enable us to keep you informed. A lot of discussions have revolved around PGA financials recently, and the changes in their department.

This year is a Hall of Fame year, and we will be accepting nominations through August 1. Our Women's Committee had a productive year in 2023. Thanks to Committee Chair Megan Spero, Bridget McLaughlin, Jenna Soranno, Becky Dengler, Sara Muldoon, and Courtney Curcio for serving on this committee.

Thank you for allowing me to serve as our vice president of this great Section. I continue to learn more every year and have enjoyed serving our members. Our Section staff is so well organized and they make our jobs so much easier. I really appreciate them and hope you do as well. Lastly, I hope you all have a wonderful season in 2024 and if I can help in any way please do not hesitate to reach out.

Pace of Play Policy: Based on trends that have been a consistent pattern over the past few seasons and our current participation levels. The committee is adjusting our pace of play policy on our hard card. In the upcoming weeks this will be finalized. Our goal is not to penalize, but to make players aware of their pace when behind and create

a more enjoyable day for the tournament field at whole.

Lastly, as a thank you, the members of the Philadelphia PGA Section for making this the best Section in the country to both play and work. As stated before, as a competitor within our Section, please show your appreciation to our sponsors and staff. It is so simple and so important. ### **Executive Director's Report**

I hope this note finds everyone doing well as we roll into another season. We finally had a little bit of winter so hopefully you had the opportunity to take a breath and enjoy time with friends and family. As you have hopefully read in the other officer and committee reports your Section officers, board, staff, and committees have been hard at work preparing for a successful 2024 season.

As you read in Bob Hennefer's report, we had a very successful 2023 season financially with a nice windfall at the end of the season. This gave us the opportunity to pay off our one outstanding vehicle loan so at this point we only have what's left on the mortgage for the office which sits at \$225,000. We had a decent year in our restricted fund and were able to pay for some capital expenses including a new roof and HVAC unit for the building. That

account currently sits at \$612,000.

As we look at long-term planning, there have been conversations around what our homesite options could be. As we look at the value of the building is that equity better served by leaving it in the building or selling the building and putting the gains back into our restricted fund and go back to leasing space. As PGA of America REACH Foundation Philadelphia and our internal team grows, we will most likely need some more space in the future, so we are currently looking at a few different options. We will keep everyone updated as those plans solidify. I would like to thank Barb Creveling for all of her work managing our dayto-day finances for both the Section and PGA of America REACH Foundation Philadelphia!

We saw nice growth in the Philadelphia PGA Junior Tour last season. Thanks again to Leilyn, Joe, Cassie and the entire tournament team for all of their hard work. One of the biggest highlights was our FUNdamental Tour and our partnership with Operation 36. We look to capitalize on that growth to solidify it as a continuous feeder system into the main tour. If you are hosting a junior tour event this season or have hosted in the past, we thank you for your support. Our junior tour is a major part of the growth of the game in our region as well as a major part of our operation as a Section. Please do whatever you can to support the program. Be a host, a marketer, a mentor or just an ambassador as you are the main connection to the kids that are the future of golf.

We have had a couple of staff changes going into the new season. Leilyn has moved on to take a position outside of golf administration. We wish her the best and thank her for all of her hard work. Cassie is going to be moving over to become our next PGA WORKS Fellow and working with the foundation and communications teams. This will

We are looking forward to another good year with our tournament program. That would not be possible without the work of Brian Schulte and the entire tournament team. It also wouldn't work without the support of our partners. Please take every opportunity to thank them for their support of our membership and programs.

A big thank you to all of our host facilities, and especially Scott Chisholm of Rolling Green G.C., Sam Ambrose of Chester Valley G.C. and their respective memberships for playing host to the 103rd Philadelphia PGA Professional

Championship!

## **Youth Golf Report**

hank you to everyone who continues to support junior golf within our section. Below are some highlights for the upcoming junior golf season. Please take a moment to familiarize yourself with these offerings and consider introducing them to your facility.

**Drive, Chip & Putt:** The 2023 Drive, Chip and Putt season was a success for the Philadelphia PGA Junior Tour. The tour saw 974 participants at the local qualifiers (up from 945 in 2022) and 227 participants at the sub-regionals. In 2024, our section will once again host 10 local qualifiers, two sub-regional qualifiers and one regional qualifier and will hopefully surpass the 2023 qualifier numbers. The qualifiers are open to boys and girls ages 7-15. Boys and girls compete in separate divisions over four age categories. For more information, please

Philadelphia PGA Junior Tour: The Philadelphia PGA Junior Tour had 920 members in 2023 (an increase of 100 from 2022). There were 3,930 tournament rounds played (an increase of 475 rounds from 2022). We aim to exceed the 2023 numbers this season as we have once again partnered with Op36 to grow the FUNdamental Tour, in addition to our regular junior tour. The FUNdamental Tour is designed for boys and girls ages 7-18 who are beginning their journey into tournament golf. The FUNdamental Tour provides opportunities for those whose ability is in the growth stages. The junior tour would not be possible without the support of our host PGA of America Golf Professionals and facilities, and the Section would like to extend a sincere thank you to all who hosted events in 2023. The 2024 Junior Tour Tournament Schedule is currently on phillyjuniortour.com and all events are open for registration. Our staff is finalizing FUNdamental Tour and fall events to complete the

calendar.
